## SHARE YOUR PLEASURE WITH LESS FORTUNATE PEOPLE!

Life Christian Adventure (LCA) is asking people to donate a small portion of what they spend annually on their sport or hobby. LCA, in conjunction with Life Christian Foundation, will use the money generated to provide food, infrastructure and education to individuals and organisations in need.

Through adventure camps and mentor programmes they would also like to introduce less fortunate children to the outdoors.

For their first project the two associations involved bowhunters and archers, including clubs and hunting game farms in South Africa. They received an eland bull, two springbok, a blesbok and an impala as donations.

The meat was either processed into biltong and *droëwors*, which was sold, or distributed to families in need. The following organisations benefited from the donations:

- Life Christian Foundation
- Kings Kids in Vanderbijlpark
- Promise Centre in Mozambique.

The project is being extended in 2011 to involve other hunters besides bowhunters and archers. "Through different types of contributions, we wish to provide food and necessities to needy people and organisations," says LCA founder Henrie Degenaar.

The three main ways in which hunters could contribute are:

- money, for which a tax certificate will be provided;
- donation of meat – should a hunter only take the trophy, the meat could be donated;
- donation of an animal – here a person or a farm could donate an animal to be hunted.

"LCA is all about combining Christianity with the outdoors," Degenaar explains. "We live in a beautiful country where we are blessed with many activities during which we come in contact with God's creation. The heartbeat in LCF is to draw a new generation of disciples and worshippers into ministry and service that are creative, attractive and efficient.

"We build on the truth of God's Word but are determined to use methods that are new, fresh and relevant in the world we live in."
